It had been a long four years for Daniel, Peter's dad. His last memory of his son, prior to Peter's placement with CIC, was when his son ran across a field and jumped in his arms. It was on that day Daniel heard his son and ex-wife were moving from South Carolina to Florida. Unfortunately, when Peter's mother was no longer able to care for him, Peter was placed in foster care. When that placement ended, Peter found a new home and second family in The Children's Neighborhood.

During Peter's stay, his young faith grew and grew. Peter enjoyed attending church and faithfully went on Sundays, Wednesdays, and any other time we said, "Let's go!" Shortly before he left, he approached our staff and asked to be baptized. It was our joy and pleasure to see Peter choose to follow Christ, and with that outward sign show the world how Jesus changed him on the inside!



Although Peter only stayed with us approximately a year, when asked how long he had been here, Peter replied, "About a million years." We all laughed but a piece of me knew one year away from home is a long time for a child even when you love where you are. CIC Takes Giant Steps Forward— Ken Hair, Executive Director



After completing the first full year of successful operations of the Children's Neighborhood located in Ft. Walton Beach, CIC has taken the next giant steps. On February 7th, CIC was awarded their Department of Children and Families operations license for 2009 and secured a contract with Families First Inc. for foster children placements. The first year of operations was a collaborative effort with the United Methodist Children's Home, for initial staffing, training and operations. During the first year of operations, the Susan B. Wesley Emergency

Shelter and Blessings House Family Foster Home have provided a loving and safe home for over 100 children from the immediate four counties. The Children's Neighborhood has been operating at or near capacity and has been consistently under budget. The past Florida Director of Children and Families and other senior childcare officials have called it a "model project".

Dr. Judy Manning recently joined CIC as the Children's Neighborhood Operations Director, thanks to a grant from the Dugas Family Foundation. Dr. Manning is a con-

summate advocate for children's issues in the areas of abuse and neglect. She is an accomplished therapist and an innovative teacher devoted to lifelong learning.

Thanks to St. Simon on the Sound Episcopal Church and a grant from the Jessie Ball duPont Foundation, Debbie Buchanan assumed the position of Development Director last month. She has vast experience in marketing, development and special events, training and coordination.

Susan Sause also recently joined CIC as the Education Liaison. This position was made possible by a grant from the Jim Moran Foundation. She has six years of teaching experience along with seventeen years of school administration at all levels.

A milestone we take great pride in is the recent completion of the Dugas Family Foundation Neighborhood Center. The great support from the Dugas Family Foundation and the Dugas Family is a wonderful example of concern and commitment.

Another significant milestone is the completion of the Kids' Clubhouse Recreation Center in memory of Tommy Sandefur and made possible by support from Crawford Sandefur. The Kids' Clubhouse will give the children a place to have indoor group activities, birthday parties, tutoring sessions, movie nights, computer training/games and a children's library.

We will dedicate the Dugas Family Foundation Neighborhood Center, the Kids' Clubhouse and the recently completed Charles Davis Rigdon pavilion, on May 21st at our Neighborhood Celebration. I hope all our many friends and supporters can attend.

Additionally, the construction began on the next Family Foster Home, Sue Sue's House. This was made possible by the support of the Dr. Doug Porter Family and the Destin Charity Wine Auction Foundation.

We continue to take GIANT STEPS in our development and progress. With your continued support and God's blessings, together we will provide a home and safe haven to hundreds of children in crisis.

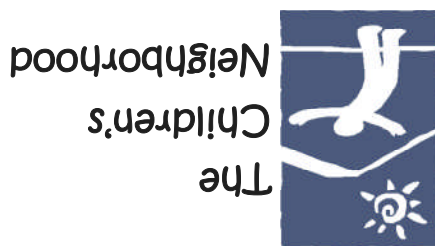
